Who We Are

Elizabeth House is a specialized treatment centre for pregnant women (including pregnant teens) and young parents, including fathers. We are situated in the west end of Montreal, close to Metro and bus routes.

Our mission is to support young pregnant women and families in difficulty. Through its residential and external programs, Elizabeth House provides a full range of rehabilitation services to help young pregnant women adjust to pregnancy and to help young parents adapt to their role as parents.

Elizabeth House is a vital organization that provides safe and caring places where vulnerable young parents - especially young mothers - can care for their children while acquiring the confidence and skills to build strong, stable and loving families.

We are dedicated to the education, health and well-being of women and children. We are dedicated to building strong families.

The young women and young families whom we help come from difficult backgrounds. Many come from underprivileged environments with a history of family breakdown, violence and abuse. Very few have adequate role models for parenting; most have little, if any, social support, and none have financial resources to fall back on. Yet they are confronted with the responsibilities of parenthood and independent living.

Our goal is that these young, high-risk moms (and dads) and their children become vibrant, contributing members of society and not dependent on the social services network.

Who We're Recruiting

We are currently seeking dynamic, community-service oriented individuals with an interest in serving on our Board of Directors. Elizabeth House board members are expected to attend board meetings regularly in order to help carry out governance responsibilities. They are also expected to participate on at least one board committee.
